Choose your offering date. The Christmas Fund offering is received by many congregations on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, which falls on December 19 this year. You can also receive the offering on any Sunday of your choice. Some churches choose Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, or the Sunday before Epiphany.
