Invocation

One: As poet Ada Limon says, "We're forgetting we're dead stars too...look, we are not unspectacular things."

All: We've come this far, survived this much.

One: What would happen if we decided to survive longer?

All: To love harder?

One: What if we are called to love beyond what we thought possible?

All: What if we are asked to receive beyond what we thought we could hold?

One: Scripture tells us that love is overflowing and everlasting, and so in faith we light this wreath. (Light the four candles)

All: We light this circle of love, and we pray that it is reflected in us. Amen.
